New voter ID cards have been mailed to all registered voters in Macomb Township.



## START RAKING: YARD WASTE PICK-UP ENDING

Leaves have changed color and are falling to the ground. It's time to start raking, bagging, and getting your yard waste to the curb. There are just a few weeks left until yard waste pick-up ceases for the winter. Yard waste pick-up runs from April 1 through the second full week in December every year.

Trash services will also be delayed one day for Thanksgiving.





## SEWER REPAIR WILL SHIFT TRAFFIC AT 21 MILE AND GARFIELD

Repair work to a sewer will cause a shift in traffic at 21 Mile Road and Garfield Road. The sewer is in the west right of way of Garfield Road and construction will necessitate the closure of the southbound curb lane of Garfield Road through the 21 Mile Intersection. There will be a traffic shift, but both northbound and southbound traffic, as well as all driveways, will be maintained. There will be no disruption to water or sewer service. The traffic shift is expected to begin around November 14, 2022, and remain in service until the end of January 2023.
