ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS WELCOMES NEW MEMBERS

Two new members were sworn into the Zoning Board of Appeals during the January 25 Board of Trustees meeting. Paul Mazzara, a service engineer for Ford and a 47-year resident of Macomb, was approved and sworn in as the newest member of the ZBA.

James Gammicchia, Community Economic Development Director in Roseville and an eight-year resident of Macomb was approved and sworn in as ZBA Alternate Position.

The Zoning Board of Appeals consists of five positions and members must be a resident and serve 3-year terms. They decide all variance and definition requests regarding land division and development ordinances.

WINTER TAX BILL: PAY NOW, STRESS LESS

While the last day to pay winter taxes without a penalty isn't until February 14, you can pay now to avoid unnecessary stress. Between December 1 and February 14, you can pay your bill with no penalty. On February 15, a three percent late fee will be added. At that point, you will have until the end of February to pay the bill. If it is still not paid the bill is transferred to the county and they will add a five percent fee.
