**Township Voter Turnout Among Highest in State**

Clerk Pozzi commends voters for engagement in the democratic process

*Macomb Township, Mich.* – Macomb Township voters proved themselves to be among the most engaged and dedicated in the state after turning out in disproportionate numbers for the February 27 Presidential Primary Election.

Reported by the Macomb County Clerk's Department, Macomb Township had a turnout of 19,932 voters, which is the second highest in the county after Sterling Heights. Sterling Heights, with a population of over 132,000, had 22,151 voters compared to 19,932 in Macomb Township with a population of 92,298.

Macomb Township's nearly 20,000 voters were the 7<sup>th</sup> most in the state and exceeded the turnout of larger cities including Warren, Dearborn, Clinton Township, and Lansing. Macomb Township's voter participation is even more striking given the local initiatives and proposals that were also on the ballots in several other communities.

"It's wonderful to see that our voters are among the most educated and committed voters in Michigan," said Macomb Township Clerk Kristi Pozzi. "Their participation highlights the value Macomb Township residents place on having a say in our future."

As we look back on this significant achievement, we look forward to our community maintaining the high level of engagement in future elections and local initiatives. The remarkable turnout serves as a powerful reminder of the impact that informed and active participation can have on our democracy and the collective future of our communities.
